Sailing Duties.

Please take a look at it and involve yourselves as we must have effective rescue and OD cover to operate as a club.

Volvo Champions Club.

Recently we have been in discussion with the RYA experts regarding the opportunity to establish our club as a Volvo Champions Club. This is all about focussing on the teaching and development of sailing skills in young people. As a club we have many aspirations in common with the RYA Youth Training teams so it seems that this is an achievable goal for the club over a period of time. There are real benefits to be had for the club if we can gradually meet their criteria and if it attracts and persuades youngsters to get into our sport that can only be a good thing, for the club and the sport in general.

Race Academy.
