Update from our Training Centre

It has been a very successful year in terms of training at Scammonden. We have run 12 courses, with over 50 candidates successfully gaining a RYA accredited certificate.

The courses covered have included Level 1 (Start Sailing) and Level 2 (Basic Sailing) Dinghy courses, Level 1 and Level 2 Powerboat, Safety Boat as well as First Aid.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mark Clarke our Chief Instructor who has worked very hard throughout the year in ensuring that



the courses are run professionally, effectively and are tailored, where possible, to individual need and experience. I would also like to thank SWSC Dinghy Instructors who have volunteered to assist at the courses, as well as Guy and Hilary Liddell and Gus Allert for their expertise and assistance on the Safetyboat. You really are a great team!

Our intention as a club has been to provide the opportunities and resources to enable all of our members to improve their sailing as well as becoming more competent when using the powerboat.

Eleven members have taken up the Powerboat course, with ten members completing their Safetyboat certificate. As it is a fundamental requirement for the club to provide safety cover whilst we are using the water we would ask every member to benefit from such opportunities so that we are better able to safely operate and manage the rescue boats.

Thirteen individuals have started and further improved their sailing with us during the sailing courses. Through course participation we have also increased our members, with many joining the club. To those members, we welcome you and look forward to sailing with you soon.

As we look towards next season we will continue to provide RYA quality training and certification at competitive prices within our welcoming and family-friendly club.
